

Night Surf Show Ready

50 Riders To Participate In Novel Event

Duke Kahanamoku, Hawaii's famed swimmer whose skill on the waves has not diminished though he's in his forties and bears the dignified title of city-county sheriff, will lead the 50 or so surf-riders who will take part in the Outrigger Canoe club's big surfing-by-searchlight spectacle off Waikiki beach at 9:30 p. m. tomorrow.

The exhibition is presented with the cooperation of the army posts near the beach, whose big searchlights will illuminate the surf to mid-day brightness with millions of candlepower. The surf has been rising during the past two days, and the waves are expected to be "just right" for good exhibition riding.

Hundreds of Honolulu residents are expected to line the beach along with the fleet personnel, for whose special benefit the unprecedented program is being staged. The event will be plainly visible to guests at the Royal Hawaiian hotel's dance tomorrow night—in fact, the exhibition may be plainly viewed from any point

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
