- 6. Don't openly tipple from a bottle on the beach or become boisterously drunk.
- 7. Don't swear or use obscene language while on the beach.
 - 8. Don't be a "water clown," pests."

- Don't throw lighted cigarettes on the sand where barefoot bathers may step on them.
- 10. Don't be a "masher," forcing your attentions on others when they are not wanted.
