## Plans To Start Training Work Almost at Once

### Queen Surf Riders Will Not Start Activity Until July 1

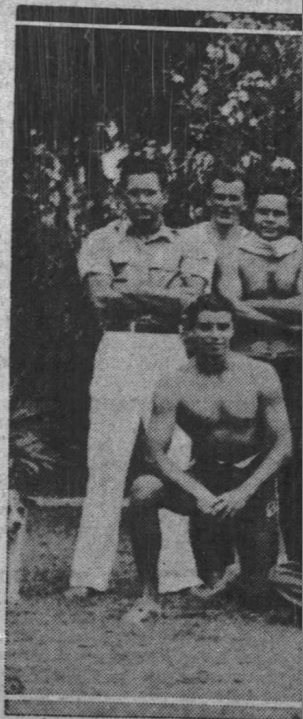
Approximately 30 members, both seniors and juniors, of the Outrigger club attended the meeting called yesterday morning by "Dad" Center, coach, for the purpose of drafting preliminary plans for the selection of crews to compete with those of the Hui Nalu club and the Queen Surf Riders in the competition for the Kona race entries.

All of those present at the meeting registered as applicants for places on the six crews to be selected. Coach Center plans to start training almost immediately in order that crews may be picked before July 1.

The six crews for the Outrigger club will be the six paddle senior men and four paddle senior men, six paddle junior, four-paddle junior, six-paddle girls and six-paddle boys under 15 years of age.

The Queen Surf Riders will not start working until July 1, according to Charles Amalu. Their plans call for five crews under the same classifications as those set for the Outrigger club, except

there will be no girls crew.

John Kaupiko, speaking for the Hui Nalu club, said they would also begin training and selecting on July 1, and will have six crews in the competition of the same in the competition of the same classifications as those announced for the Outrigger organization.

Training will go forward during the entire month of July, according to the plans of all three clubs and the elimination races will be held between August 1 and 10. The two best crews will represent Oahu in the Kona races to be held on August 24.

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
