

Queen's Surfers To Train In Their New Canoe Today

IN GOOD CONDITION

For more than a month the strictest of training rules have been observed and as a result the condition of the crews Sunday is expected to be better than ever before in the past. The Sunday regatta is an elimination to determine the preferential positions of the three clubs and their crews in the annual Kona championships on August 24.

The Honolulu event will not lack for rivalry, for the three Waikiki clubs have many an old grudge to settle and feeling is tense along the beach front, with virtually every person partisan one of the three ways.

Lineups of the Hui Nalu and Queen's Surfers were made public by club coaches yesterday but Coach Center declared last night that he would not issue his final list of crews until late this afternoon. The Outrigger boats have been given several shakeups in order to obtain greater coordination and more power into the strokes of the various crews and Center said that he still believed he could add a bit more speed to

his crews by making a few minor adjustments in the lineups.

Pier 2 will be the scene of the start and finish of all but the two paddle events, which will get away from Pier 11 and drive down across the Pier 2 finish line. Accommodations for a large crowd are being prepared and automobile parking space will also be available at 25 cents. General admission is priced the same.

Revenue received from Sunday's regatta will be used to defray the expenses of the three clubs when they send their crews to Kona August 24 to challenge for the Hawaiian title, which is now being guarded by the crack Kailua crews.

While Honolulu will be witnessing the big event here Sunday, all Kona will be standing by to get news of the results and particularly the times of the various races. Interest along the Kona coast is the greatest ever seen there and not only Kailua but the other crews this year will be ready to make warm competition for the invaders from the "big city."
