

SIX EVENTS IN HARBOR SUNDAY

Program Is Warmup Affair For Big Races Off Kona Late This Month

Starting at 9:30 a. m. tomorrow and lasting, it is hoped, no later than 11:30, the Honolulu harbor will be the scene of a canoe paddling regatta.

Highly trained crews from three clubs, the Outrigger Canoe club, Hui Nalus and Queen's Surfriders, will ply their paddles in a six event program.

The races, while staged as a warmup for the big August 24 regatta at Kailua, Kona, on the island of Hawaii, are expected to be spectacular and just as hard fought as any championship.

A small admission will be made and the committee in charge has announced that the best point of vantage for the starts and finishes of the races will be at Pier 2.
