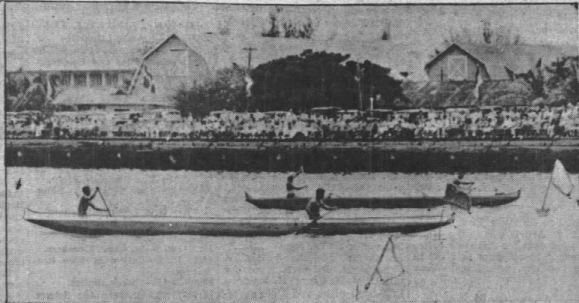
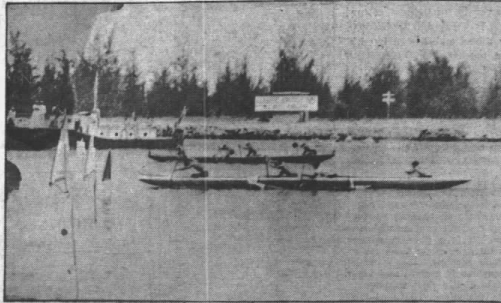


Crews Make History In Honolulu Harbor . . . Some Of The Finishes . . . And Were They Close!

ington treaty expires next year and Japan and Great Britain do not want naval ratios and limitations."

"Expiration of the naval treaty leaves us free to fortify our island outposts," he explained. "This must be done because American supremacy on the Pacific is a vital necessity. We cannot afford to permit anything to endanger it."
