

HUI NALUS COP CANOE HONORS

Tally 28 Points In Practice Regatta Sunday In Har- bor; Outriggers Second

The Hui Nalu clearly demonstrated Sunday morning that this year Kona is going to have to step some to retain its laurels won last year at Kealahou bay in the canoe races. Displaying all around strength, it won the top honors yesterday in the harbor by totaling 28 points to the Outrigger Canoe club's 18. The Queen's Surfers were third with nine and the Beach Patrol last with six.

The senior six event was won by the Hui Nalu crew in 12 minutes flat after a thrilling race during which it was closely pressed by the Queen's Surfers crew.

This race proved to be one of the most exciting of the day and it wasn't until the last few yards that a Hui Nalu victory was assured.

The Nalu crew was composed of Henry Aikue, Fred Steere, Francis Wai, Allen Taylor, Ah Kong Pang and Sergeant Kahanamoku.

The kids race was also won by the Hui Nalu crew, which completely outclassed a game bunch of youngsters from the Outrigger club. This event was won in 5 minutes 55 seconds.

Best Race of Day

The junior four event was easily the most thrilling event of the day. This event ended in a dead heat between the Hui Nalu crew and the Beach Patrol four. Stroke and stroke they raced the entire way and as they swept across the finish line it looked like a Patrol victory at first, but the judges announced that it was a dead heat. This race was a real thriller and it kept the spectators on their feet. The time was 13 minutes flat.

Outrigger finished third with Queen's fourth.

The wahine race was won in 6 minutes 57 2-5 seconds by the Outrigger Canoe club girls, who took the lead at the outset and were
