

DANCE TONIGHT AT THE BEACH

A joint annual pre-regatta dance sponsored by the Outrigger, Hui Nalu and Queen's Surfers will be held at the Outrigger Canoe club pavilion tonight at 8:30. Proceeds of the dance will be used to defray the expenses of the clubs which will make the Kona coast trip next week to participate in the annual canoe race on August 24.

All indications point to a banner crowd tonight at the Outrigger dance. Hundreds of canoe fans and members of the different boat clubs are expected to attend.

The Inter-Island announces that the Waialeale will leave Honolulu on the 23rd at 7:30 p. m. for the Kona excursion. They have made plans for a sightseeing trip, a picnic lunch at the City of Refuge, a regatta luau at night and a Hawaiian entertainment program for the passengers who hope to make the regatta trip.

Departing for Honolulu at 11 p. m. Saturday after the regatta day's program is over, the Waialeale will dock at Honolulu shortly before noon Saturday.

Will Take Crews

The Itasca will again take the Honolulu crews to Kona this year. It also will act as the official patrol boat at the races and will furnish regatta officials with the crafts to conduct the races.

Honolulu crews taking part in the races are reported to be going through some stiff practices in preparation for the Kona events. Local crews will have to show a better brand of canoe paddling than they did last year if they are to get anywhere in the coming races, according to close followers of the aquatic sport who report a vastly improved and determined Kona crew awaiting the invaders at the Hawaii races.

Reservations are now being taken at the Inter-Island for the Kona excursion.
