

# Yates Sending Two Canoes To Dean Paddlers

Julian Yates, well known rowing enthusiast and Kona, Hawaii, supervisor, is sending, according to Theodore (Pump) Searle, graduate manager of athletics, University of Hawaii, two outrigger canoes for the U. H. crews to use in the forthcoming June 11, Kamehameha Day, canoe paddling activity in Honolulu harbor.

The canoes are expected to arrive in a few days. Through the courtesy of Mr. Yates it will soon be possible for the Green and White paddling aspirants to begin active preparation for the regatta.

According to Searle, plans are being completed to make the affair, which marks the 200th anniversary celebration of the birth of King Kamehameha I, a colorful water festival. Ten crews will be seen in each of the races, taxiing the course to its limit.

Approval has also been given to the new course layout at Pier 2 that George (Dad) Center and Searle proposed. The change will make possible a three fourth mile straightaway, running parallel to the pier, where the bleachers will be located.
