

NEW RECORDS SET IN SWIMS

Two records were broken in The Star-Bulletin Memorial Day long distance swims held at the War Memorial natatorium this morning, keen competition featuring each of the three races.

Barney Pung, brawny Hui Makani splasher, took the lead from the start in the one mile junior men's event, and while R. Downey of Citywide A. C. held on gamely, won easily in 24 minutes 44 4-10 seconds, to break by more than half a minute the mark set up in 1935 by D. K. Martin. L. F. Freeman, Navy, was a surprise third.

Olga Clarke, swimming her first race for months', captured the half mile swim for women open by more than a lap from Shizu Tamagawa, 40 & 8 club, making a new record of 13 minutes 3 1-10 seconds.

Miss Clarke, representing Outrigger C. C., turned in a sparkling performance, and had she been pressed all the way apparently could have lowered the criterion further.

N. Hamada, outstanding Hui Makani natator, won the one mile men's senior swim from his teammate D. K. Martin by many yards.

Henry Sakamoto, 40 & 8 club, was a good third. Time for this race was 23 minutes 23 3-10 seconds. Hamada holds the present meet time at 23 minutes 12 2-10 seconds.
