

# Outrigger Canoe To Be Hea

Hawaii will be taking it's outrigger canoe racing very seriously on Kamehameha Day when representative crews from all the islands compete for honors in Honolulu harbor from 2:00 to 5:00 p. m.

KGU has completed arrangements with the Standard Oil company for the sponsorship of this event and the pep rally which will precede it the night before at the Outrigger Canoe club, Waikiki, 9:30 to 10:30.

Charles Amalu, rowing committee chairman, has announced eight crews are hard at work going through the finishing process for the big races.

To date eight crews have registered, three from Kona i.e., Honaunau, Kailua and Milolii; one from Kauai and four Honolulu crews, the Outrigger, Queen's Surf, Hui Nalu and Healanis. Girls crews are entered for each of the Kona crews and all the Honolulu crews except Healanis.

Quoting Charles Amalu. "I am sure the races will all be hard-fought. Reports from Kona and Kauai tell us how sure the boys are they will take the Honolulu crews into camp, but you can tell them for Honolulu they will have plenty of competition. Our boys and girls are all wonderfully fit and are paddling in good form and the humuhumunukunua-puaas will not be able to swim fast enough to "go swimming by" them.

The race course is laid in Honolulu harbor with the starting and finish line opposite the center of pier 2. From the 5000 bleachers which will be erected there everyone can see the crews in action at all times during the races.

KGU's coverage of the various events will give all those not in attendance as clear a conception of what is going on as words will convey. The Standard Oil company invites all listeners to tune in the broadcast.
