

NEW RECORDS ARE MADE IN COMPETE

Barney Pung, Hui Makani Splasher, Registers New Rec- ord for the Mile Swim

HONOLULU, June 1—Two new territorial long distance swimming records stood on the books today after Saturday's annual Memorial Day swim, sponsored by The Honolulu Star-Bulletin.

Barney Pung, brawny Hui Makani splasher, held the junior men's one mile record of 24 minutes 44.4, which bettered by more than half a minute the mark set by D. K. Martin in 1935. Pung took the lead at the start and finished with a clear victory, despite determined competition from R. Downey of Citywide A. C., who finished second.

The second new mark was established by Olga Clarke, one of the territory's leading feminine stars, who won the half mile women's open race in 13 minutes 3.1 seconds. She took the race by more than a lap from Shizu Tamagawa, 40 and 8 club.

Miss Clarke, representing the Outrigger Canoe club, was in good condition for the race, despite a long layoff. With closer competition, sports writers believed she would have lowered the mark even more.

N. Hamada, star of the Hui Makani, won the one mile men's senior swim by several yards from his team-mate, D. K. Martin. Henry Sakamoto, 40 & 8 club, was third. The time: 23 minutes 23.3 seconds. Hamada holds the present meet time of 23 minutes 12.2 seconds.
