In honor of the occasion, members presented Duke with a koa steering paddle, with the following inscription on a silver plate: "To Duke P. Kahanamoku, aloha. Twenty-five years ago you startled the world with your record-breaking performances. Accept this token from the Kamaaina Beachcombers' Hui."

During the afternoon, members participated in athletic events, and several "beach boy" orchestras entertained with music. "Bing" Crosby, famous radio and screen crooner, was a guest at the luau, and joined in many of the songs.
