REGATTA RESULTS

Honaunau swept off to an early lead by capturing three of the first four races of the inter-island canoe regatta held today in Honolulu harbor in conjunction with the Hawaii jubilee celebration.

Hui Nalu upheld the honor of the Honolulu crews by capturing the third race—boys under 16—in handy fashion. In the feature race the Hui Nalu paddlers brought the crowd of 6,000 fans, who braved an intermittent drizzle, to their feet by matching Hunaunau stroke for stroke. On the final lap Honaunau pulled ahead but a gallant spurt brought the Hui Nalu canoe to within 10 feet of the Kona boys as the gun barked.

In the fifth race for boys under 18 the Queen's Surf-Riders pulled in after a hard fought race to collapse with exhaustion over the finish line.
