

Nuuanu Y Sweeps Team Events At ASUH Swim

The monthly ASUH swimming meet, which was postponed from last Friday, was held last night at the University of Hawaii tank with diving, 100-yard freestyle, 100-yard breaststroke, 100-yard backstroke, and the 400 and 300 yard relay events on tap.

Those competing in the meet were the University, Nuuanu Y, Citywide A.C., Punahou, Outrigger club, Hui Nani, Roosevelt and Unattached swimmers.

Powlison of Citywide turned in two brilliant performances, winning the 100-yard freestyle for boys in the fast time of 57.3 seconds, and the 100 yards backstroke for boys.

Nuuanu Y virtually swept the relay events, taking the 400-yard open for men novices, the 300-yard open event, and the 300-yard race for men novices. The other relay, 400 yards for men, open, was won by the University, with Nuuanu Y coming in second.
