

# Hawaiian AAU Disapproves Regional Tryout System; Sends Wire

**T**HE board of governors of the Hawaiian AAU yesterday went on record as opposed to the regional boxing tryouts to be held preliminary to the national championships, starting next year, and sent a wire to the National body voicing their objections.

Under the present plan, Hawaii would come under the jurisdiction of region seven or the Southern Pacific division and to become eligible for the national tournament, Hawaii boxers must survive the elimination tournament of that region.

The board of governors suggested the creation of a separate region for Hawaii.

## DISAPPROVES STRONGLY

The AAU also appropriated \$100 to the swimming committee to help defray the expenses of sending a team to the Mainland this summer.

The army and the other islands will be invited to participate in the annual AAU track and field championships next May. Neal Blaisdell is the chairman of the track committee. Plans are being made to form a team to compete against the Canadian track and field aggregation which will be enroute home from Australia early next month.

Nine clubs were either admitted or reinstated in the AAU and they are Outrigger Canoe Club, Kahuku A. C., University of Hawaii, Matson A. C., St. Patrick, Kauai Athletic Union, Uluniu, Molokai Boxing club and Star-Bulletin. The Aiea A. A. has been invited to join the AAU.

Weight lifting was added among AAU sports and Robert Brillande was named chairman.
