

TRIALS TO BE HELD IN WATERHOUSE POOL WEDNESDAY EVENING

104 Men and 85 Women Natators Entered in Aquafest—Finals Scheduled for Friday Night—Stubby Kruger to Show

One hundred and eighty-nine swimmers, representing the cream of territorial natators, have registered for the second annual Duke P. Kahanamoku Indoor meet scheduled for Friday night in the Elizabeth Waterhouse Memorial pool. Of the number, 104 are men swimmers and 85 women.

Entries for the forthcoming aquafest closed over the weekend and the registration list was announced yesterday by Theodore (Pump) Searle, president of the Kamaaina Beachcombers' Club, which is sponsoring the meet in conjunction with the Associated Students of the University of Hawaii.

Trials will be held Wednesday evening starting at 7 o'clock. Stubby Kruger, former island swimmer, world's backstroke champion and record holder, who returned to Honolulu at the invitation of the Beachcombers for the express purpose of displaying his bag of tricks at the meet, will put on a few of his acts at the trials. Consequently, a slight admission charge will be made.

Leading Aqua Comedian

Kruger is rated as the leading water comedian in the world and has entertained thousands of aquatic fans, with not only freak swimming but also thrilling and funny dives.

Kruger who turned professional in 1928 has been doing comic dives and swimming for 20 years.

All the best swimmers of Honolulu are entered in the meet, also the standout swimmers of the island of Maui, namely K. Nakama and T. Hirose. The Valley Islanders will no doubt give Barney Pung, leading Honolulu natator, a bitter race in each of the events in which they are entered together.

NEW YORK, May 1.—The case of baseball pitcher Lefty Gomez and June O'Dea will reach the courts tomorrow when hearings are opened on June's suit for separation from the Yankees star left-hander.

Miss O'Dea, a former star pitcher, is suing Lefty on the grounds that he threatened her with death during their relatively brief married life.

Miss O'Dea is asking for \$200 a week alimony and \$3,000 counsel fees. Gomez is paying June \$75 a week temporary alimony at present.
