

Beach Boys Off To Maui In Outrigger

Four husky beach boys will swing an outrigger canoe into the Waikiki surf at daybreak today and strike out for Maui in almost the traditional manner of the chiefs of old.

One slight difference will distinguish this first trip in modern times between Oahu and Maui by outrigger and the centuries of voyages achieved in the past

At the stern of the 35½ foot Ka Moi, longest and largest canoe in the islands, a 16 horsepower outboard motor will be attached to ease the wearisome miles of paddling.

Headed For Fair

Four members of the Waikiki Beach Patrol, Sally Hale, Tommy Kiakona, Harry Robello and William Chick Daniels Jr., are making the trip. They are headed for the Maui county fair.

The boys will leave at 5:30 a.m. today from Waikiki and head through the Molokai channel to Kaunakakai where the "put-put" will be refueled and provisions taken aboard. The last long distance outrigger jaunt was to Molokai 10 years ago. Three hours were expected to negotiate the channel this time, with the aid of the outboard.

The Ka Moi will then head for Maui, making a landing either
