Sally Says Feat 'Pupule Stunt'

Four beach boys from Waikiki, who launched their motor-driven outrigger canoe, the 35½-foot Ka Moi, in front of the Outrigger Canoe club Wednesday night with the Maui fair as their destination, beached safely in front of the Lahaina post office at 8 a.m. today, and their first words to a welcoming crowd were to warn others not to try "such a pupule stunt."

"It's too dangerous," said Sally Hale, leader of the group, which also included Tommy Kiakona, Harry Robello and William "Chick" Daniels. Nevertheless, they'll start canoeing back to Oahu at 4 a.m. Sunday. The return trip will be even more dangerous unless the wind subsides.

Hale said the boys would surf their way home on a zigzag course, trying to cross the Molokai channel before the wind becomes too high.

The four paddlers left Kaunakakai, Molokai, their first stop, late last night after repeated delays by routh weather.

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
