

# CANOE CLUB'S PLANS DRAWN

Tentative plans for rebuilding the Outrigger Canoe club at Waikiki beach, probably during the summer months, were announced today by Walter J. Macfarlane, president.

In the front of the club, space will be provided for housing seven canoes, an office for the Waikiki beach patrol and a concession stand.

A covered pavilion from which members will be able to view all activities on the beach will occupy the front space of the second floor. Sun bathing facilities, cabanas and beach lounging facilities will be placed in the remaining space of the second floor.

Ground space fronting Kalakaua Ave., now used as parking space, has been released to the Territorial Hotels Co., Ltd., it was stated, and store buildings probably will be erected on it.

Members will gain entrance to the club by a walk. On each side of the entrance and running back toward the beach will be lockers, on the right men's and the left, women's and children. In the patio in between, volleyball, badminton, handball and paddle tennis courts will be laid.

Under the new arrangement, the grounds will be restricted to club members, Mr. Macfarlane said. In the past, nonmembers have been permitted to go through the grounds to gain entrance to the beach.

The new clubhouse will be on the site on which the Uluniu club is now situated. The Uluniu club will be given space on land between the Outrigger club and the Royal Hawaiian hotel where the former's hau lanais are now.
