

Cafe Society To Be Represented In Beach Sailing Series

STARTS ON SUNDAY

Doris Cromwell, Leilani Topping Entered In Big Event

Cafe society will be well represented in the first race of the Pualani (Gloria Baker) Topping outrigger canoe sailing series starting Sunday morning at 10 a. m. at Waikiki, according to the list of skippers and crews for the races announced yesterday by Sally Hale, captain of the Waikiki Beach Patrol.

Nine crews filed entries for the series and heading the list competing for his recent bride's award is Henry J. (Bob) Topping who will skipper the Pualani canoe, christened after his wife.

Vying for the cherished trophy in the David Kahanamoku crew will be Jayne (Leilani) Topping, Bob's former wife, while in the Sam Kahanamoku canoe will be Doris Duke Cromwell.

Nine Canoes Entered

Nine canoes equipped with unlimited sails, will compete in the series which will be extended over three weeks. At the end of these three races, the three leading craft computed on the points accumulated in the series (five points for first, three for second, two for third and one for fourth) will compete in a race the following week at which time the canoe that wins will be declared the prize winner and receive the trophy.

Other skippers in the race will be Judge Hary Steiner, Jack Briscoe, Johnny Makua, Dad Center, John D. Kaupiko, Sr., and Charlie Amalu.

Starts At Beach

The course calls for the start in front of the Royal Hawaiian hotel out and around a buoy located off the Elk's club, keeping the buoy on the starboard side; then around a buoy located off Popular Surf, again keeping the buoy on the starboard side; then around a buoy located off Cunha's Surf keeping the buoy on the port side, and then to the finish line which will be between a buoy located off Blow Hole Surf and the judges' boat.

On the judges' boat, Wikiwiki, skippered by Captain Cunningham, will be Mrs. Pualani Topping, Mrs. Marion Dresser, Mrs. Cecily Briscoe, Miss Mary Connelly, Mrs. "Splash" Lyons and the following judges: Sally Hale, Jack Hjorth, Joe Miner and Splash Lyons.

Each canoe will be allowed a maximum of two paddles and any paddling on the part of the steersmen or crew will result in disqualification. No handicaps will be allowed.

No substitutions will be allowed in the announced crews excepting for illness.
