The Eleu, skippered by Sam Kahanamoku and a pick-up crew; Patches, the Queen's Surf entry, with Charlie Amalu as helmsman; and the redoubtable Black Maria from Hui Nalu, captained by Allan "Turkey" Love.

Due to the fact there was only one turning marker at each end of the course the canoes were closely bunched on the turns. The Ka Moi led the field to the first buoy and rounded the second turn on even terms with the Patches

and the Eleu, but failed to cross the finish on the proper side of a third marker and was disqualified, The Patches and the Eleu were also ruled out of the race due to other infractions of the rules and

the Black Maria from Hui Nalu was named as winner. The crew received six Kahanamoku shirts as a reward. There was a great deal of dissatisfaction expressed by the losing crews and another race will be held next Sunday over a

course which has no turns.
