

# Expect Records In Star-Bulletin Swim

It is expected that at least one and probably more of the standing records for The Star-Bulletin Memorial Day swimming meet on May 30 will be broken this season.

N. Hamada of Hui Makani holds the one mile record for senior men at 23 minutes 12.2 seconds. James Tanaka of Nuuanu YMCA last year churned his way to a new record of 23 minutes 40.6 seconds in the mile race for junior men.

Olga Clarke holds the record for the women's half mile event in 13 minutes 3.1 seconds. She failed by 17.7 seconds to break her record last season.

Last year Kiyoshi Nakama of Maui easily won the senior men's title, but he failed to set a new record.

Takashi Hirose of Maui finished first in the junior men's mile last year but was disqualified because he received coaching from the platform by another Maui swimmer. The Maui swimmer who was coaching Hirose had been warned several times by the referee to stop but continued, necessitating the decision.

It is expected that Hirose will swim again this year. He has a good chance of copping the senior event.

Swimmers will be in top shape for The Star-Bulletin meet. The Duke P. Kahanamoku swimfest is listed on May 26 and 29. The Star-Bulletin contest will be held on the following day.
