

Program Set For Aquatic Carnival

A complete program of entertainment and athletic contests for the Pacific Aquatic Carnival is being staged here July 3-24 inclusive was announced last night at a meeting of the committee in charge.

The carnival, which is being sponsored by the Kamaaina Branch-combers' Hui, The Star-Bulletin A. A. and The Associated Students of the University of Hawaii, has the endorsement of The Hawaiian Association of the AAC.

The carnival features Hawaii's best swimmers and surfmen against a team of 16 stars from Australia. Paul Wolfe, U. S. 100 yard freestyle swimming champion, and Bob Pirie, Canadian and British Empire freestyle champion at all distances.

Robin Biddulph, Australian freestyle champion, is the mainstay of the swimming squad from Down Under.

Reports from various subcommittees at last night's meeting indicated that the situation is well in hand and that everything will be in readiness for the big carnival when the Australians arrive here on July 5. Wolfe arrives from the mainland the same day.

Tickets are already on sale for the outdoor swims at the natatorium July 12 and 14. Tickets for the aquatic show to be staged on Ala Moana canal Sunday morning, July 16, and the indoor swims at Punahou tank July 19, will be placed on sale in a few days.

The central ticket office is at Cecil Benny's Jewelry store on Fort St.

The complete program follows:

When the steamer docks Duke will have Australian team gathered together on pier to be met by reception committee presenting leis and lauhala hats to team. A parade will be held, led by the Royal Hawaiian band, up Fort St. to Beretania, down Bishop to King to capital grounds where team will be presented to governor. From palace grounds, team will go to city hall to be presented to Mayor Crane and the board of supervisors. From city hall, team will be taken to park where we hope to have the police glee club and other Hawaiian entertainment, besides numerous gifts of Hawaiian fruits for the visitors. From park team will be taken back to the wharf for their luggage. From the wharf they will go to the Army and Navy Y where they will stay while they are in the islands.
