Second phase of the Pacific Aquatic Carnival, featuring rowing and paddling races, will be held this morning at Moana channel.

As an added feature, a half mile swim for both men and women will be held. It will be the first event of the day starting at 8:30.

Robin Biddulph of Australia, Bob Pirie of Canada, Kiyoshi Nakama, Carlos Rivas, Bummei Nakama, and Peter Powlison are the men swimmers entered.

Women natators who will vie for honors are Mary Ann Hawkins, latest swimming sensation of Citywide AA, Mitsuko Higuchi, Toyoko Takeyama and Fujiko Katsutani of Maui.

Australians Compete

A race that will feature international competition is the life boat race between Australia and the Territorial Beach Patrol. The Beach Patrol crew won the right to represent Hawaii in an elimination series. The race will be over one-half mile.

Canoe paddling and barge rowing races are also on the program. In the canoe events, Outrigger has been assigned lane three and the Hui Nalus who will have two crews in each race, will paddle in lanes one and two.

Lane assignments of the barge races were announced as follows:

Senior—Japanese 1, Navy 2, Myrtle 3.

Junior—Healani 1, Japanese 2, Myrtle 3.

Freshmen—Myrtle 1, Japanese 2, Healani 3.

Novice—Japanese 1, Healani 2, Navy 3.

Intermediate—Navy 1, Healani 2, Japanese 3.
