

Kaupiko Heads New Waikiki Beach Patrol

A program consolidating all commercial operations at Waikiki under the Beach Patrol, with the dual intention of improving services to the public and amalgamating the commercial activities of the Hui Nalu with the Beach Patrol, was approved by the directors of the Outrigger Canoe Club yesterday.

Walter Macfarlane, president of the Outrigger Canoe Club, announced that the directors had selected John D. Kaupiko, Sr., to head this new set-up. He said Mr. Kaupiko, a familiar figure at Waikiki for a quarter of a century, was the logical appointment for this place both because of his ability and because of the general high regard in which he is held.

Other phases of the program, dealing with surfboard instruction, outrigger canoe riding,

swimming instruction and the rental of beach umbrellas and equipment, will be studied by a special Outrigger Canoe Club committee, Mr. Macfarlane said.

Headed by Duke Kahanamoku, this committee will consist of George "Dad" Center and Bill Hollinger. It will hold a meeting in the next day or two, Mr. Macfarlane said, at which Mr. Kaupiko and his assistant, "Sally" Hale, will confer on the details of the Beach Patrol organization. The entire program is to become effective Aug. 15.

The Hui Nalu was to have vacated its property to make way for a rebuilding program projected by the Moana hotel. Last week, however, the Hawaiian Hotels Co., which leases the property, granted the Hui Nalu an extension of time to permit

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
