

JACK MAY AND JOE PANG GRAB SURFING RACES

Jack May and Joe Pang hogged the spotlight in the Hawaii Surfing association's regatta Sunday afternoon in Honolulu harbor.

May not only won the half mile open in addition to the 100 yard open but bettered the previous time set for the 880. He covered the distance in 4 minutes 52.7 seconds.

Pang won the 440 yard for boys under 18 and the 220 yard for boys under 16.

The Outrigger Canoe club's relay team covered the mile event in 10 minutes 16.1 seconds. This was better than the time made by the Australian team which negotiated the distance in the Ala Wai several months ago in 10 minutes 49.6 seconds against wind and current.

Outboard motorboats put on three races to break the monotony of surfing paddling events.
