

Civic Leaders Hear Outrigger Club Plans

Plans for reorganization of the Outrigger Canoe club, intended to make it a vital factor in community life, are to be revealed to heads of Honolulu business and civic organizations at a meeting called for 3 p.m. tomorrow in the Chamber of Commerce building.

Invitations to the meeting have been sent out by Walter Macfarlane, president, and by Leslie A. Hicks, general manager of the Hawaiian Electric Co., the club's finance chairman.

At the meeting the building program, which provides for a completely new plant on the leasehold between the Royal Hawaiian and Moana hotels, will be detailed. The club is financing the construction through a \$90,000 bond issue. The bonds, maturing in 25 years and bearing

interest of 5 per cent are being offered in conjunction with a membership campaign.

Tomorrow's meeting, Mr. Macfarlane said, is designed to bring home to the presidents of other civic groups the Outrigger's role in the local community. Founded in 1908 for the perpetuation of the traditional sports, the club is now prepared, its president said, to go forward with the community itself, providing beach sports for virtually everyone in Honolulu, through the various types of memberships that are being offered.
