Outrigger Club Appeal Made By President

With the Outrigger Canoe club facing a crisis, Walter Macfarlane, president, yesterday appealed to the membership, asking that they get behind the club's building project and help sell the necessary bonds.

According to Mr. Macfarlane's records, only \$20,150 of the \$90,000 bonds have been sold to date.

Various members offered their assistance and promised to contact outsiders, emphasizing that the club is a community project.

The Rev. Henry P. Judd spoke as "a member of over 20 years" explaining that the reason for the slowness of the sales, the slack in membership was because "the community is not aware of the precariousness of the situation."

"It must not be allowed to go overboard," he said, emphasizing again that the project is a good business venture, offering five per cent interest on the bonds.
