

OUTRIGGER TO HOLD MEETING

The membership of the Outrigger Canoe club has been asked to attend a meeting at 4:15 p. m. Thursday at the chamber of commerce to discuss the windup of the club's bond selling campaign, Walter Macfarlane, president, announced today.

With three weeks remaining before the deadline, Mr. Macfarlane said, the members will be urged to exert their best efforts to put the campaign over the top.

The members also will be informed of a change in the financing plan for the club. Originally, plans for the new buildings on the leasehold at Waikiki called for a bond issue of \$90,000 and a total expenditure of more than \$100,000.

C. W. Dickey, architect, has devised several short-cuts in construction, however, and the total cost of the project can now be held to about \$70,000, Mr. Macfarlane said.

Under the terms of its agreement with Hawaiian Hotels, Ltd., the club must start building its new plant on the site between the Royal Hawaiian and Moana hotels by January 1 to retain its lease.

Together with a new locker room building and a clubhouse fronting on the beach, the project contemplates a broadening of membership requirements to make the club's facilities available to the greatest possible number of residents and visitors.
