OUTRIGGER CANOE CLUB.

COPY OF NEW MOTIONS AND RESOLUTIONS FROM CLUB MINUTES.

December 11, 1919.

"UNFINISHED BUSINESS: Lockers:

As there are ninety-two members awaiting locker assignments and in view of the New Bathhouse being completed shortly and that the steel lockers already ordered would not be here for about two months, it was moved by Mr. Mooney, seconded by Mr. Asch, and carried, that one hundred wooden lockers be installed to take care of our present needs."

"NEW BUSINESS:

It was moved by Mr. Asch, seconded by Mr. Bailey, and carried, that the sum of \$70.00 be appropriated and presented to the following employees, as Christmas Presents.

Mrs. Geneva Wright--	\$25.00
Sasaki	15.00
Mori	10.00
Kaga	10.00
Sio	10.00

Also, to Miss Elsie Hiorth, the sum of \$15.00 for services rendered during Mrs. Wright's absence in Hilo."

Mr. Dease brought up the matter of setting aside a sum of money for sending of a Club Representative to compete in the Olympic Games Trials to be held in the States sometime the early part of next year. After a lengthy discussion it was decided not to entertain the proposition."

January 8, 1920.

"CAPTAIN:

The Captain presented a letter received from Mr. P. H. Nottage asking the Club to equip and enter three Basket Ball Teams during the coming season. After a general discussion it was moved by Mr. Mooney and seconded by Mr. Bailey that the Club set aside a sum not to exceed one hundred (\$100.00) for the equipment of three teams to represent the O. C. Club during the coming Basket Ball Season. Carried."

January 8, 1920.

"NEW BUSINESS:

It was moved by Mr. Bailey seconded by Mr. Mooney that the Board of Directors of the Outrigger Canoe Club are opposed to teams of the Outrigger Canoe Club competing with any Club or teams where gate receipts are taken, unless, a prearranged distribution of said receipts is made and is satisfactory to the Club Treasurer.

It was moved by Mr. Mooney and seconded by Mr. Asch that the members of all teams engaged in athletic contests under the name of the Outrigger Canoe Club be members in good standing of said Club and that a copy of this motion be posted on the Club Bulletin Board. Carried."

Another very successful year in many respects has just come to a close.

I might first mention the finances of the Club which are in quite a satisfactory condition. Exclusive of capital expenditures, we cleared about \$3000.00 (three thousand dollars.)

\$500.00 has been added to the sinking fund.

A new bath house was erected which with wooden lockers cost about \$2300.00. We also purchased, as an experiment, 100 steel lockers at a cost of nearly \$1000.00.

The cost of running the Club has greatly advanced along with the times. One item alone was the increase in assessment valuation of the premises from \$2000.00 to \$25000.00.

To partly offset the increased expense it was decided to slightly increase the charges for lady guest privileges. The initiation fee and membership dues, have, so far, not been touched.



Perhaps the greatest advance in the Club's activities was along the Athletic lines. The swimming team is too well known to need any reference from me, but in case there is anyone who does not already know, I would mention, that three of the members of that team are on their way to Antwerp included in the All-American Team.

The track and field team also did splendid work, capturing first place in the last A.A.U. Meet.

Then there were volley ball, basket-ball, and collegiate football teams, all of which were a credit to the Club, not particularly from a winning point of view, but from what is much more important,--sportmanship.

The Club dances given by our Order & Entertainment Committee were just as big a success as ever and we shall always look forward to them.

During the year we had as guests many distinguished visitors, including Hon. Josephus Daniels and Party, Admiral Lord Jellicoe and Officers of H.M.S. New Zealand, Rear Admiral Wiley and officers of U.S. Pacific Fleet of Destroyers, Admiral Hilary P. Jones and Officers and Midshipmen of Battleship Squadron of U.S. Atlantic Fleet, Sir Arthur du Cros of S. Y. Emerald and many others.

### CLUB IS MAKING GREAT PROGRESS

Warren Dease, president of the Outrigger Canoe club who was re-elected to his chair at last night's meeting of the members, gave in his report of the past year's activities the details of progress made. Here is his report:

#### Report

Five hundred dollars has been added to the sinking fund.

## Surfers Club on Excellent Basis As to Finances

Excellent financial condition was shown last night at the annual meeting of the Outrigger Canoe club, when Treasurer F. C. Bailey submitted a report showing the net income for the year over expenditures to be \$3015.62.

During the year the club's total income was \$12,440.60, and total expenditures \$9424.98. However, the cost of a new dressing room building, \$2,392.05, and of new steel lockers, \$991, brought the total expense for the year to several thousand dollars more than usual, making the club's net expenditures over income for the year exactly \$550.08.

### Still Ahead

In spite of having spent more money than was received, owing to the new building and lockers, an investment which will more than pay for itself in the next few years, the club is still ahead \$2543.42, that sum representing the money on hand June 30, 1920.

In addition to the money now on hand, the club during the year added \$500 to the sinking fund, for the purchase of Liberty bonds. This fund has a cash balance of only \$21.86, but its Liberty bonds, 23 in number, of \$50 each, represent a par value of \$1150.

### Grid Session

"The financing of the football team, which represented the club last year," says Treasurer F. C. Bailey's report, "was treated as a special issue. Total receipts amounted to \$689.68, and the total expenditures of the team to \$594.88, which shows that the season cost the club only \$5.20, and we have on hand equipment to the value of several hundred dollars, which will come in handy for the coming season.

"You will note from the balance sheet that the club's finances are at a low ebb. I would therefore like to take this opportunity to suggest to the incoming board that they practise strict economy for the coming year."

Assets of the club now total \$22,487.97. The old buildings are valued at \$10,800, and the new at \$2392.05.

## MEMBERSHIP OF SURFERS GROWS QUESTION OF SALARIES DEPATED

Steady growth in membership during the last year is shown by the annual report of Secretary Allan Podmore of the Outrigger Canoe club, made at last night's annual meeting.

The club's total membership, including seniors and juniors, is now 741, an increase of 139 over last year. The number of senior members (adults) is now 600, a gain of 84, and the number of juniors (boys) is 141, an increase of 55 over last year.

### Guest Increase

Guest cards issued during the year were 581, a gain of 237. Guests in good standing at the close of the year were 125, a gain of 68 persons.

During the year eight senior members of the club died, their names being George Andrus, Dr. H. V. Murray, J. J. Belser, Norman E. Gedge, W. H. Hoogs, J. M. Riggs, J. H. Schnack and C. H. Trullinger.

"In conclusion I wish to mention the great help and convenience the

club office has been to its members," says Secretary Podmore. A vote of thanks was given by the members present to the secretary, treasurer and President Warren Dease for their untiring efforts in behalf of the club during the last year. Their good work resulted in their reelection for the coming year.

### Salaries

The question of an increase in pay for the club's Japanese employes was brought up. "Those present seemed to think more money should be given the men owing to the increase in the cost of living and the long hours Sasaki and his assistants have to work, sometimes putting in as long as 12 and 16 hours on busy days. They have to work seven days a week as well, getting no Sundays off.

Dan E. Mooney, who was reelected vice president, paid a tribute to the work of "Dad" Center, and said that the athletic showing made during the year is one of which Honolulu should be proud. He called attention to the fact that every member of the Outrigger swimming team placed in the Olympic try-outs, and most of them are now on their way to Antwerp to uphold the reputation of Hawaii at the coming games.
