

BYLAWS OF THE OUTRIGGER CANOE CLUB

The following proposed amendments to the Bylaws are those referred to in the call of the Annual Meeting of the members of the Outrigger Canoe Club, to be held on the Club premises at five p.m. on Monday, February 26, 1973, and are recommended by the Board of Directors.

The brief explanatory notes in italics following each section are intended to assist the members in understanding the intent of the proposed revisions.

Section 25. Amend subsections REGULAR, INTERMEDIATE, ASSOCIATE and SPECIAL by replacing the word twenty with eighteen, and subsection JUNIOR by replacing the word nineteen with seventeen. All other subsections remain unchanged.

Note: Changes to conform the Bylaws to the new age of majority as was done at the Annual Meeting of 1967.

Section 26. Amend only subsection GUEST, as follows:

<p><u>Guest.</u> Guest members may be admitted to membership for periods not to exceed a total of two weeks per year by the issuance of a guest membership card by the General Manager either on application by members in good standing (except minors) in the Life, Regular, Intermediate, Associate, Island and Service classes or on presentation of a card or letter of introduction from the management of club with which the Outrigger Canoe Club has a reciprocal privileges agreement.</p>	<p><u>Guest.</u> Guest members may be admitted to membership for periods not to exceed a total of two weeks per year by the issuance of a guest membership card by the General Manager either on application by members in good standing in the Life, Regular, Intermediate, Associate, Lady, Nonresident, Island, or Service classes, or on presentation of a card or letter of introduction from the management of a club with which the Outrigger Canoe Club has a reciprocal privileges agreement.</p>

Note: The new wording eliminates the phrase "except minors" which lost its significance in 1967 when the minimum age for Regular members was lifted from 18 to 20, the former age of majority. The new wording also adds the Lady and Non-resident classes to those eligible to sponsorship of guest members.

Section 29. GUESTS AND RESTRICTIONS THEREON

<p>Any member may bring guests to the Club, provided that no such guest has had his membership terminated for cause or otherwise been expelled from the Club. No such guest shall visit the Club more than two days in any one month without written approval of the General Manager, provided, however, that this limitation shall not apply to spouses of members or ladies and gentlemen of single men and women members, respectively. All guests shall be registered upon entering the Club premises and, except for spouses of members holding valid Special Guest Cards, shall be accompanied by their hosts and shall not incur any indebtedness to the Club.</p>	<p>Any member may bring guests to the Club, provided that no such guests are persona non grata. Any person shall be persona non grata who has had his membership terminated for cause, been expelled from the Club or been so-declared by the Board of Directors; and such status shall continue unless rescinded by the Board of Directors. No guests shall visit the Club more than two days in any one month without written approval of the General Manager, provided, however, that this limitation shall not apply to spouses of members or ladies and gentlemen of single men and women members, respectively. All guests shall be registered upon entering the Club premises and, except for spouses of members holding valid Special Guest Cards, shall be accompanied by their hosts and shall not incur any indebtedness to the Club.</p>

Note: Essentially, only the first sentence of the present wording is being changed by substituting two new sentences. The present wording has the effect of denying a person forever the privilege of being a guest of a member once that person has become ineligible for guest status. The proposed wording defines "persona non grata", which status makes a person ineligible to be a guest, but provides for a procedure for placing a person in or removing him from this status.
