

PROPOSED AMENDMENTS AND REVISIONS TO THE BYLAWS OF THE OUTRIGGER CANOE CLUB

The following proposed amendments to the bylaws are those referred to in the call of the Annual Meeting of the members of the Outrigger Canoe Club, to be held on the Club premises at five p.m. on Monday, February 25, 1980, and are recommended by the Board of Directors.

The brief explanatory notes in italics following each Section are intended to assist the members in understanding the intent of the proposed revisions.

<p>The Board of Directors shall consist of fifteen members elected from classes of membership entitled to vote.</p> <p><i>Note: A lesser number of directors is a more effective Board, capable of expediting Club business in a judicious manner. (Effective with 1981 election.)</i></p>	<p>The Board of Directors shall consist of <i>thirteen</i> members elected from classes of membership entitled to vote.</p>

<p>Applications for all but Senior, Honorary and Guest memberships shall be made upon a printed application form approved by the Admissions and Membership Committee, which shall be signed by the applicant and by two sponsors who have been voting members of the Club for at least one year.</p> <p align="center">Residency Requirement.</p> <p>In order to be approved for membership an applicant must have been a bona fide resident of the State of Hawaii for a period of one year.</p>	<p>Applications for all but Senior, Honorary and affiliated guest memberships shall be made upon a printed application form approved by the Admissions and Membership Committee, which shall be signed by the applicant and by two sponsors who have been voting members of the Club for at least <i>three</i> years.</p> <p align="center">Residency Requirement.</p> <p>In order to be approved for membership an applicant must have been a bona fide resident of the State of Hawaii for a period of one year, <i>however, the Board of Directors has the authority to adjust this residency requirement from a minimum of one year to a maximum of three years.</i></p>
