

Outrigger Building Fund Nearing Goal

in Hawaii."

"It is now up to the local beach enthusiasts—and everyone else who is interested in belonging to one of Hawaii's best clubs—to pitch in and put the drive over the top."

The club now has a total of \$59,000 toward the building fund, Mr. Macfarlane explained. This figure includes some \$6,000 obtained from initiation and term membership fees. The remaining \$11,000, he said yesterday, should be raised in the month of January, permitting a tentative beginning of construction on February 1.

Although none of the money now in hand will be expended until the balance is raised, Mr. Macfarlane said that the work of razing the old clubhouse on the property between the Royal Hawaiian and Moana Hotels will begin sometime this month.

The project of rehabilitating the thirty-two year old Club was approved last summer by the board of directors and the membership and since that time Club teams have been out selling the bonds.

If the remaining \$11,000 is subscribed promptly, Mr. Macfarlane said, it should be possible to open the new Club to members about May 1.

A by-product of the bond-selling campaign, the president also revealed, has been the doubling of the membership, which now totals 600 and is still growing.
