

## D FOR NEW Woolley Gets Project; Initiation Fee Upped

Contract for the construction of the beautiful new clubhouse of the famous Outrigger Canoe Club at Waikiki was signed yesterday by Walter J. Macfarlane, president, and Ralph W. Woolley, contractor, in the offices of C. W. Dickey, architect.

Effective July 1, initiation fees of the club are being raised from \$10 to \$25. Present membership is in excess of 800, and the list of memberships will be closed at 1,000, after which persons wishing to join must be placed upon a waiting list according to Leslie Hicks, chairman of the finance committee.

### Forward Step

"Signing of this contract marks the reaching of a goal we have long desired," commented Mr. Macfarlane. "I know that every member of the club shares with me and their officers in the enthusiasm and pleasure of seeing our organization take this forward step."

"Members and the bond holders have shown the finest kokua, sympathy and patience during the past year while our financing and construction plans were being carried out. I am happy the big project will prove such an added asset to Waikiki and to Hawaii."

### Begin Job Soon

Actual construction of the elaborate project will be started within the next week or so, Mr. Woolley said.
