

## Macfarlane To Run Again

lane, Richardson, Ltd. He is president of the Outrigger Canoe Club, and a member of the Junior chamber of commerce, Representatives Club and other civic and fraternal organizations.

Rep. Macfarlane seeks reelection not only on his record during the past three sessions of the legislature, but upon a program of governmental economy based upon actualities, insuring necessary support of constructive community measures with careful pruning of unnecessary expenditures in order to maintain a budget within the limits of territorial income which may be seriously curtailed.

"I believe," said Rep. Macfarlane in announcing his candidacy, "that the next session of the legislature is going to be faced with just as severe problems as the last session was, and that every consideration will have to be given to economy."

"With war defenses, taxes, and the general anticipated future of federal taxes, industry is going to be called upon to shoulder an additional heavy burden of taxation which will mean that the territorial government will have to seriously consider its sources of revenues, at this coming session."

"I believe that the coming session of the legislature might well look into the administration of acts passed by the last session, which have caused considerable comment. I refer specifically to the civil service act, the welfare act, and the labor department act. I have heard from various sources a considerable amount of criticism. I urge that those who are interested in these various activities put into concrete form their objections, so that the matter may be looked into at the next session."

"I wish to assure those who are deeply interested in the administration of these acts that they will find me a willing and sympathetic friend."

"Two years ago I suggested it would be a good idea to look into the possibilities of getting a five-day week for government employes. At the last session, I called a public hearing on this question, and the governmental employes represented by their president, requested the postponement of consideration of this matter. I still feel that there is sufficient interest in the five-day week by the government employes as a whole, and if some plan of this kind could be worked out, even during the summer months, it would be worthwhile reviving consideration of this idea. I would like to see a committee organized specifically for this purpose, which would include not only government officials but also representation from business and industry."

"There are two other specific projects that interest me, and that I am going to personally work for. One is to give the yachtsmen at the Ala Moana Yacht basin proper facilities for their boats, and also a clubhouse which will be an asset to the community, as well as to people interested in pleasure boating. I believe this project will stand on its own feet on a self-liquidating plan."

"The other measure which I would like to see put into effect is to extend to the firemen a 30-day vacation instead of the present 21 days."
