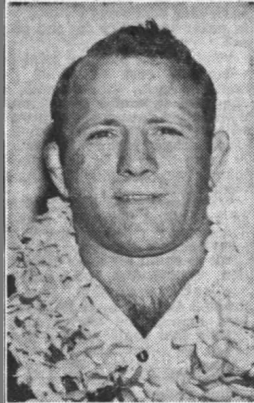


# SURFING CHAMPIONSHIPS TODAY OFF WAIKIKI; FOUR EVENTS ON PROGRAM

## Carr Set For London Test

Light - Heavies Headline Mat Card Wednesday At Auditorium

Mike (Whiskers) London, world's light heavyweight champion, meets Charley Carr in the main event of Wednesday's mat show at the Civic auditorium. Carr is the Southern States champion and one of the flashiest performers to ever show here. ### Individual, Team Events Are Scheduled; Meet Opens at 12:30

Surfing comes into its own today, as outstanding aces of the board meet in a revival of competitive events, off Waikiki.

Starting at 12:30, four events are scheduled on the program of trick surfing, paddleboard races, exhibition, and team events.

#### Registration Open

Activity is open to amateurs and professionals alike, with no entry fee. Contestants may register between 9 and 11 this morning at the Banyan court, Moana hotel.

Events are scheduled as follows:

1—Open surfing championship. This event will take place either at the first break surf or canoe surf and contestants will take their place between two buoys at the breaker line. At the signal from the official starter, who will be stationed in an outrigger canoe at the breaker line, the surfers will try for the first wave in the series. Ten judges stationed at the finish will judge on ability to control their board while standing, their stance and general appearance.

2—One mile open paddleboard race. The starting point will be at the beach in front of the Moana hotel. All contestants will paddle out and around a marker a half mile from shore, return to the beach carrying their board past the finish line.

3—Open team surfing championship. This event is limited to four men to a team, the procedure the same as in the first event. One man from each team will take a wave at a time until all four have ridden.

4—Tandem surfing. Grace, skill and general appearance will count in this event, in which women are expected to compete in numbers. A silver cup will be presented to the winning team and medals to second and third place winners.

The committee in charge includes O. B. Patterson, well known surfer; Walter Napoleon, captain of the territorial beach patrol; William Brooks, surfer, and John Lind.

Judges will be William Bowman, Jacob Y. Ing, C. B. Broderrick, Gary Uchida, Charles Neal, John McMahon, Warren Kanne, Hiram Aushu, O. B. Patterson and McGregor Thomas.

Announcer in charge of the public address system will be Fred Barnett. Cecil Benny will be timer and Ted (Pump) Searle, George (Dad) Center, Lorrin P. Thurston, Walter Macfarlane and John D. Kapiko honorary judges.
