NTO the new Outrigger Canoe Club have gone the same skilled crafts-manship, the same quality of materials, the same conscientious supervision that have made other Ralph E. Woolley buildings outstanding examples of modern construction. The Laie Temple, the Kress Buildings throughout the Territory, the Royal Hawaiian Hotel, Farrington High School, the officers' quarters at Hickam field and many other projects of the Army and Navy in Hawaii, prominent downtown office buildings, all bear the mark of quality that will endure through many, many generations. The same is true of the Latter Day Saints Oahu Stake Tabernacle and the Sears, Roebuck building, now under construction.

¶ Aside from the material phases of producing a building for Outrigger Canoe Club members, those of us who have participated have done so with pride in the kamaaina background of the old organization which has done so much for water sports in Honolulu. Those kamaainas who were responsible for the first Outrigger Club in 1908 may take pride, too, in the growth of which the new building is testimony.
