

# Beach Sports To Be Feature Of Outrigger Club Opening

Beach sports will be the feature attraction on tomorrow's opening of the new Outrigger Canoe Club. In keeping with the tradition which the Outrigger club has maintained since the old clubhouse was started in 1908, surfboard races and canoe sailing together with volleyball will be among the Kamehameha Day beach sports.

The afternoon program of athletics will be highlighted by the second annual William (Bill) Leeds trophy surfboard paddling championship. This event is for the Hawaiian championship and is limited to Hawaiian style boards. A limitation of twelve feet maximum is required and the board is restricted to redwood or cedar with balsa or hollow boards barred. The race will be over a course starting in front of the

Royal Hawaiian Hotel to a turning buoy in front of the Wakiki Tavern and back to the Royal for the finish.

The second leg of the three legged trophy series will have Sam Kahanamoku again an entry defending the championship he won in the first race last year.

## **Ten Entries Expected**

Among the other water sports will be the canoe sailing race for the Flanders trophy, a silver plaque. This race will be contested by several entries from the Outrigger as well as the Kahala group of amateur canoe sailing sportsmen. There will be about ten entries for this trophy offered by Walter Flanders.
