

Yachtsmen To Be Feted On Arrival

A dinner will be staged on the night of July 24 at the Outrigger Canoe club to honor the crew members and skippers of the seven yachts currently competing in the transpacific yacht race.

Four trophies have been donated for the race which started off at San Pedro July 4. They will be presented at the Outrigger Canoe club dinner.

To the winner of the transpacific competition will go the Governor's trophy. The Los Angeles chamber of commerce trophy will be presented to the second place winner. The Transpacific Yacht trophy will go to the yacht placing third.

The winning boat will also receive a yacht club trophy.

14 Day Crossing?

It is estimated that the first yacht will arrive in Honolulu within 14 days.

The slowest yacht is expected in by July 24.

The finish mark for the racers will be a line extending from the Diamond Head lighthouse to the red flashing buoy about three quarters of a mile off shore and beyond the bouy for a mile.

Checking in the yachts will be the race committee boat which will be stationed near the finishing line.
