

# Ka Moi First In Beach Race

## Waikiki Patrol Entry Cap- tures Kearns Trophy; Hoonau Second

The Waikiki beach patrol entry, the Ka Moi, again showed her heels to the fast field and romped home sixteen minutes ahead of Gordon Fischer's Hoonau yesterday in the final event of Outrigger Canoe sailing races. The Nukunuku was third with John Dee Kaupiko as skipper, and John Ernstberg's U-Telling-Me was fourth. Time for the six mile course was an hour and three minutes, setting a new record.

This victory gives the Ka Moi the Tommy Kearns trophy for the Labor Day race, and also the Royal Hawaiian hotel trophy for winning the greatest number of points in the series of three races.

In addition to the grand prize and the Kearns trophy, the winning crew was also presented with individual trophies donated by Jack Bowden of the Outrigger Canoe Club.

Doris Duke Cromwell's Lahilahi limped home ahead of Charlie Amalu's Keeaumoku. Sam Kahanamoku, skipper of the Lahilahi again ran into trouble with his jib in the brisk wind.

### Ka Moi Takes Lead

Right after the start the Ka Moi went into the lead, closely followed by the Lahilahi at the first buoy. Rounding the turn smartly she increased her lead steadily and was never headed. Keeling over in an effort to reach the turn without tacking, she broke her forward outrigger, but repairs were made by Tommy Kiakona while still under way which enabled her to hold her lead. Chick Daniels was absent through illness, but his substitute, George Stepp, carried on ably in his place.

Wylie Mather again placed his cabin cruiser at the disposal of the judges for use as committee boat, he was ably assisted by Jack Bowden and Tommy Kearns as judges.

The other officials, Herb Fox, Hiram Anahu, Neal Iferson, Bill
