

Julie Judd Swanzy, Kamaaina, Dies Here

Mrs. Julie Judd Swanzy, a member of one of Hawaii's oldest families, a pioneer in Hawaii educational work, and for many years a leader in Honolulu philanthropic activities, died at 8:15 o'clock last night at her home, 2020 Manoa Road.

Mrs. Swanzy was 80 years of age when death ended her full kamaaina life.

She was the widow of the late Francis Mills Swanzy, for many years managing director of Theo. H. Davis & Co., Ltd., and was an aunt of former Governor Lawrence M. Judd.

Born in November, 1860, she was the daughter of Col. Charles Hastings Judd, chamberlain, privy councillor and private secretary to King Kalakaua, and a granddaughter of Dr. Gerrit Parmele Judd, minister to King Kamehameha III from 1842 to 1853.

Attended Punahou

Mrs. Swanzy was educated at Punahou and at Mills College, from which she was graduated in 1879.

Her marriage to Mr. Swanzy took place Nov. 9, 1887, the year after her father left the King's service.

For nearly three score years, Mrs. Swanzy was a leading civic and social figure in Honolulu. Her home was the meeting place for women leaders from the four corners of the earth. She was selected as honorary chairman of the Women's Conference of the Pan-Pacific Union when it met at her home in 1928.

Active in Education

Perhaps her best known work was in the educational field. She established and directed activities of the Free Kindergarten and Children's Aid Association for
