

Outrigger Club Bond Drive and Lei Day Plans

Combining the usual Lei Day of sports with war efforts, the Outrigger Canoe club is launching a vigorous war bond drive. The drive will start April 27, but only bond purchased on May 1 will hold the Lei Day stamp, a hula girl presenting a wreath to a soldier. A bond booth will be installed in the club lobby.
