Former Rep. Macfarlane Dies On Coast

Was Stricken With Typhoid, Pneumonia After Trip to Mexico

Walter James Macfarlane, member of a kamaaina Hawaiian family and a member of the territorial legislature for many years, died in the Highland Hospital at Oakland, Calif., of typhoid fever complicated with pneumonia at 10:20 a. m. yesterday (Honolulu War time), according to a United Press dispatch received by The Advertiser.

Mr. Macfarlane was stricken after returning from a trip to Mexico several weeks ago.

Family at Bedside

In Oakland at the time of his death were his wife, Mrs. Audrey Macfarlane; his father, Walter Macfarlane, Sr.; his mother, Senator Alice Kamokila Campbell, and a sister, Mrs. Walter Flanders of Palo Alto.

The elder Mr. Macfarlane went from Honolulu to the Mainland by clipper after being informed of his son's illness. Senator Campbell was in Washington in connection with her plans to interest officials there in her program for the homesteaders on Molokai. She returned to the Coast by plane early this week
