Macfarlane Memorial Rites Sunday

Memorial services for Walter James (Kalanikini) Macfarlane, 35, widely known Honolulan and member of a prominent island family, will be held at 9 a. m. Sunday at the Outrigger Canoe club.

Mr. Macfarlane died in an Oakland, Cal., hospital Friday morning. The Rev. Henry

P. Judd will officiate and Elmer Lee's troupe of Hawaiian musicians will play.

Funeral services were to be held in Oakland at 3:30 this afternoon, PWT, at the Halstead mortuary. The body will be cremated and the ashes brought to Honolulu for interment.



Mr. Macfarlane, who was engaged in the advertising business here, and who was formerly a 4th district representative, had been ill a little more than a week.

Death was due to typhoid fever, which he contracted while traveling on the mainland, complicated by pneumonia, and by a recurrence of asthma from which Mr. Macfar-

lane had suffered for many years. At the bedside were Mr. Macfarlane's wife, Mrs. Audrey Macfarlane, who is living with her parents in Mexico City, and whom he had visited before becoming ill; his father, F. Walter Macfarlane, who flew from Honolulu to Oakland to be with his son, and his mother, Senator Alice Kamokilas Campbell of Molokai, who had
