

Great Water Carnival Is Set

Macfarlane Day on July 4

All you lovers of water sports, attention!

The Outrigger Canoe club committee has arranged a water carnival on July 4 that is a water carnival.

A glance at the list of 16 attractive events should make your eyes pop and before the program is over (and it'll take about four or five hours to runoff) about every and all types of water propelling craft in this area will have been seen in action.

The occasion, of course, is the first Walter Macfarlane Memorial races at Waikiki beach.

The committee announced that the nifty looking Mid-Pacific sailing boats from the Kaneohe Yacht club will open the day's activities at 11:30 a. m. Mixed tandem surfing will follow.

A feature surfing event, the open championship, comes off about noon, and it will be followed with outrigger canoe paddling competitions for both men and women, tug of war and relays.

All in all, it will be a gala day and should match the most colorful water pageants ever attempted in the good old days by King Kalakaua himself.

The day's program follows:

1st event: The Kaneohe Yacht club will enter their Mid Pacific sailing boats known as the "M. P."

2nd event: Mixed tandem surfing championship.

3rd event: Open surfing championship.

4th event: Juniors six men canoe race—around markers two times coming back parallel with the shore to finishing line. (One trophy to be awarded.)

5th event: Girls six men canoe race—

one time around marker and back to finishing line. (One trophy to be awarded.)

6th event: Boys six men crew race—one time around marker and back to finishing line. (One trophy to be awarded.)

7th event: Service-enlisted men canoe race—one time around. Any of the enlisted men, either army, navy or marine is welcome to enter in this race. (1st and 2nd prizes.)

8th event: Service-officers canoe race. (1st and 2nd prizes.)

9th event: The Walter Macfarlane perpetual trophy—six men crew—three times around marker either paddling or surfing in on the third time around the marker and parallel with the beach for the last 200 yards to the finishing line directly opposite the Outrigger Canoe club. (Six individual trophies will be awarded to each of men in canoe.)

10th event: Women's four men crew—open—parallel with the beach.

11th event: Tug of war—10 men.

12th event—Two men canoe—parallel with the beach.

13th event: Four men canoe—parallel with the beach.

14th event—Six men canoe—parallel with the beach starting in front of the Outrigger, around the marker by the Halekai and returning to finish in front of the Outrigger.

15th event: Fathers' race — six men crew.

16th event: Relay race—starting point at Halekai, change crew at the Outrigger Canoe club. Return to Halekai around the marker, change crew, and back to the Outrigger Canoe club at the finishing point.
