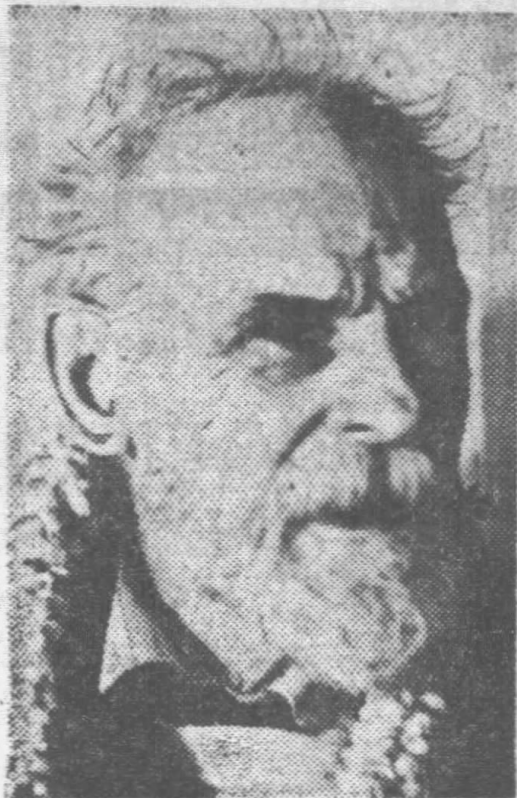


Alexander H. Ford, Civic Leader, Dies

Alexander Hume Ford, one of the best known men in the Pacific area and the organizer of numerous civic enterprises in Hawaii during his residence of 39 years in the islands, died early Sunday morning at a local hospital.

Mr. Ford, who was 77 years of age, had been living in retirement at Waikiki spending most of his time during the day at the Outrigger Canoe Club, which he founded in 1908 to promote surfing and other aquatic sports. Three weeks ago he suffered a stroke and was taken to the hospital.

The Outrigger Canoe Club announced yesterday that memorial services for Mr. Ford will be held at the club at 4:30 p.m. Tuesday. The services will be open to club members and all friends of Mr. Ford who wish to attend. The body is to be cremated and the ashes returned to Georgetown, South Carolina, for burial.

Mr. Ford is survived by a nephew, Lucas Ford, living in Hilo; a sister, Miss Mary Ford, and a sister-in-law, Mrs. F. W. Ford, both of Georgetown, South Carolina.
