Big Isle Crews May Come Here July 4

In an effort to revive prewar aquatic activity and enthusiasm at Waikiki beach the Outrigger Canoe club will stage a series of 11 outrigger canoe and surf board races tomorrow afternoon at Waikiki, preliminary to resumption of the annual July 4 carnival.

Gay Harris, canoe chairman, presided at a meeting of the committee in charge of arrangements Thursday night at the club where final plans for the Sunday program were decided.

The Sunday aquatic program will mark the celebration of Kamehameha Day, with present plans calling for resumption of the Kamehameha pageant in 1946.

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
