

Samuel Starratt Rites In Nuuanu Cemetery Today

With the Rev. John Dunstan, associate minister of Central Union church, officiating, services for Samuel M. Starratt, 81, who died at his home, 1728 Poki street, Thursday afternoon, will be held at the graveside in Nuuanu cemetery at 2 p.m. today. Family services were held over the ashes Friday at Williams' mortuary.

Born in New Brunswick, Canada, in 1865, Mr. Starratt went to Maine as a young man and later moved to Newport, R. I., where he worked as a civil service employe until transferred to the Great Lakes Training Center, where he acted as supervisor of construction for that base.

Coming to Honolulu in 1911, he held the position of superintendent of construction at Pearl Harbor.

Mr. Starratt was building superintendent of the Bishop Trust Co., and as a member of the Outrigger club, planned its bath houses and pavilion. He retired from business in 1939.

Mr. Starratt was a widower and is survived by a daughter here, two daughters in Illinois, Mrs. Albert L. Hall and Lillian B. Starratt, and a son who has been here since August, 1945, and seven grandchildren.
