

Ala Moana Waves 'Five Or Six Feet'

At the Ala Moana incinerator site, the water dashed over a sea wall which is normally about 5 to 6 feet above sea level, according to a Mr. Tirrell, at the incinerator.

At Black Point, Mr. and Mrs. Eaton Magoon reported that the fourth wave had struck at about 7:15. The Magoon home is located about $\frac{1}{4}$ mile Koko Head of the lighthouse at Diamond Head and water estimated at 8 to 9 feet above normal was flooding into the yard at their home. In the interval between waves, Mrs. Magoon said, the water dropped far below normal before rising again.

Some canoes at the Outrigger club were reported washed out to sea and others piled up on the beach. Water was reported on the Royal Hawaiian hotel grounds.
